


CATECHUMENATE SESSION: DISCERNMENT

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Key Teachings



Questioning

People kept asking John the Baptist who he was and what he had to say for himself. He answered that he was not the Christ. His task was to point the way to Christ.

Choosing the Right Path

discern

To discern is to be able to judge wisely or to make wise choices.

On the third Sunday of Advent, it is the custom for children in Rome to bring the Christ Child figure from their home Nativity sets to Saint Peter's Square. The pope then blesses their figures, which are called *bambinelli* (baby Jesus).

We Listen

For the second week, we have heard about John baptizing with water. And twice we hear John the Baptist point away from himself and toward Jesus. Jesus is always the central focus in the Gospel. Jesus is the light that John is not.

We Believe

We believe in the power of Baptism. We believe that by the power of the Holy Spirit, we are united with Christ Jesus through his Death and Resurrection.

We Live As Disciples

Disciples learn how to discern the voice of Jesus. The Holy Spirit helps us to recognize Jesus' voice. Your fellow disciples will help you discern how God is working in your life and how Jesus is calling you. At some point in your journey, others will help you discern whether you are ready for the Sacraments of Initiation.

We Pray

The third Sunday of Advent is often called Gaudete Sunday. *Gaudete* is a Latin word that means "Rejoice!" As you light the pink candle of the Advent wreath, say "Rejoice in the Lord!" and invite everyone gathered to name a gift from God that brings them joy.
